# WHISKEY



When Chicken Cock Whiskey Founder James A. Miller started making whiskey in Bourbon Co., Kentucky in the 1830s, bourbon wasn't even bourbon yet.

Seeing the increasing value of his liquid creation, Miller formally established Chicken Cock Whiskey (thought to be named after the rooster feathers he used to stir his drinks with) in 1856. Chicken Cock hit peak prestige when it was served as the house whiskey at the **Cotton Club in Harlem**, one of Prohibition's most legendary speakeasies.

In 2012, **Grain & Barrel Spirits** rediscovered the brand and set out to resurrect it to its Prohibition-era glory. Today, Chicken Cock Whiskey's **Master Distiller Gregg Snyder** oversees all parts of the whiskey-making process from bark to barrel, bourbon to bottle, and the whiskey is distilled at **Bardstown Bourbon Company's** Collaborative Distilling Program facility.
