

Paulaner Salvator Double Bock, Father of All Strong Biers



Often copied, but never equaled . . .

Paulaner's brewing history begins with this beer. It was the Paulaner monks, who invented this unfiltered bottom-fermented double bock. This beer has been brewed for more than 375 years - always adhering to the original recipe, with only a few refinements over the years.

The head has a caramel hue and the beer is full bodied with a rich, warm chestnut brown color. The taste is unmistakable, with its smooth chocolate flavour, robust dark caramel maltness and a light note of hops in the background - providing a nice intensity on the palate. Often copied but never equalled: it's the father of all double bock beers!



Paulaner is brewed in strict accordance with the Bavarian purity law of 1516, using only water, malt, hops and yeast.
